

## **Year 11 NCS Summer Programme**

Dear parent/carer,

I am writing to inform you of a fantastic opportunity that is being presented to our year 11 students the weeks commencing the 24<sup>th</sup> of May and the 7<sup>th</sup> of June. These are the last two weeks that students will be in school with us at Ernulf Academy, and to recognise all their hard work this academic year, we have worked with the National Citizens Service to create an engaging and alternate programme.

The programme will be split into two weeks with students work in small teams of around 15 students. On the first day of the programme, Monday 24<sup>th</sup> of May, students will be taking part in a variety of exciting practical activities such as a practical assault course to develop each teams' communication and teamwork skills. The remainder of the first week will provide students with opportunities to build on skills they will need in the wider world of work, and for their post-16 ventures next academic year, trough planning a community-based project within their teams. In the second week of the programme, from Monday 7<sup>th</sup> of June until Thursday 10<sup>th</sup> of June, students will then be out in the community completing the project they have planned during the first week.

This is a programme that NCS would usually roll out and advertise to students to sign-up for over the summer holidays and would normally come at a cost of £50 per student. As this programme is being delivered in school, NCS are able to offer this completely free. The programme is also a nationally recognised award and students will be provided with a certificate of completion upon finishing the programme.

In order for students to be able to access the programme, they will be required to sign up online. To facilitate this, NCS will be coming into school on the afternoon of Friday the 14<sup>th</sup> of May to deliver an assembly where they will talk students through the sign up. For this, students will need to know the following information; home address and postcode, parent/carer email address and parent/carer contact number. Once students have signed up, an email will be sent to the email address of the parent/carer that the students have put on their sign-up forms. For students to be allowed to take part in this programme, the forms that you as parents/carers receive in the email from NCS and are asked to complete must be submitted online by **Monday 17<sup>th</sup> May.** If these forms are not received, students will not be able to take part in the programme.
